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## Sea kayaking and camping in Bohuslän, part A

## Why this brochure?

As more and more people discover sea kayaking, we believe there is a need to know where in this seemingly barren landscape you can pitch a tent. Welkayakers, but also the nature and the land owners: If many good spots are known, the wear on each of them will be less.

I remind you that free camping is possible with reference to Sweden's Right of Public Access, but also with the limitations imposed by this Right. Many of the sites are on private land, meaning the limitations must be strictly considered. Please read about the Right of Public Access in the brochure, page 15.

This instruction comes with the electronic (PDF) version of the brochure. That means you will take care of the print-out yourself. See further in this text for instructions on how to print.

You can use this document for your private use, print a new copy when needed etc. You are free to distribute it to others, put it on your webpage for download etc. The materaial must not be altered or distorted in any way, and the name of the creator and copyright holder (Jens Marklund) must always be stated. You must not sell the files in any way, they can only be given away free of charge.

## How to make a print-out and get it right

This document is to be printed on A4 paper, to be folded once to size A5 and stapled toghether to a brochure. This means the papers must be printed on both sides, and explains why the pages seem to be in disorder. It will be in perfect order when you have made your print-out, following these instructions.

- Choose **landscape orientation.** print this paper and put it beside your computer.
- Load you printer with good paper, preferably glossy and around  $100~\mathrm{g/m^2}$  quality.
- Use an ink jet or laser printer with at least 300 dpi resolution.
  Possibly you may have to reduce the printing size (to, say, 97 %) to fit your printer.
- After testing with page 1, print **page 1-10**. Note that we are referring to print out numbers, not what is says on the pages themselves.

- Turn the printed pages, put them back into your printer and print **pages 11-20**. Check the printing order, this may vary from machine to machine. **Page 11 should be on the back of page 1**, page 12 on the back of page 2, and so on.
- Fold all the papers, one by one, press hard (use your nails or the back of a spoon). There is a thin grey line on pages 1-10, it can be used for folding and should be outside the fold.
- You can also forget about this folding marks and just fold the papers edge to edge.
- Now look at the **page numbers** printed on the sheets. Put them in order by these numbers.
- Staple the brochure together or use strong sewing thread to make a binding.
- Use a sharp strong knife and a stiff ruler to cut the free edges even and clean.
- An alternative is to cut all the sheets by the folding markings, and then put them into size A5 heat lamination pockets. Just watch out for the page order!
